### URBAN SPORTS FESTIVAL 2025 - COLLABORATION WITH ABA , DUNK GRASSROOTS AND SURF GHANA



Africa Breaking Academy, Dunk Grassroots, and Surf Ghana partnered for the maiden edition of the Urban Sports Festival on January 25, 2025, at Ghud Park, Accra Mall. Financed by the French Embassy in Ghana, the festival spotlighted breakdance as the highlight of the urban sports event, receiving extensive media attention. As part of the Afro Break International Championship regional qualifiers, ABA visited Kenya and Uganda to select national champions.

The qualifiers attracted enthusiastic crowds, witnessing intense battles as dancers competed for a spot in the Africa Finals in Accra, Ghana, in November.

Bboy lil dan Champion from DR Congo and Bboy Pencil Champion from Uganda emerged victorious and will represent their countries on the grand stage.





## ADA SCHOOLS OUTREACH - BREAK IT ALL EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT PROGRAM

On February 26th, ABA reached out to four schools in Ada under the Break It All Educational Support Program: Elavayor D/A Basic, Ada Foah D/A Basic, Big Ada D/A Basic, and Faithkope D/A Basic.

Over 1,500 students were engaged in motivational workshops, breakdance demonstrations, and educational support, with donations including 1,000 exercise books.

The outreach aimed to empower underserved communities by integrating dance into education and challenging traditional gender roles. We invite support from corporate organizations, funding agencies, and individuals to sustain this impactful initiative



## GHANA YOUTH BREAKING LEAGUE (FEBRUARY - MARCH 2025)

ABA launched the Ghana Youth Breaking League, offering a competitive platform to nurture Ghanaian breakdance athletes.

Held on the last Saturday of each month at Nima-Mamobi Community Center, the league features a standardized point-scoring system to identify top talents and prepare athletes for the Dakar 2026 Youth Olympics.

The first two editions in February and March were a success, and the journey toward building Ghana's next breaking champions is well underway



## INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY WORKSHOP

In celebration of International Women's Day, ABA hosted a workshop featuring Girl Fufu from Germany.

The session honored the achievements of female breakdancers and offered specialized training, including adapting training routines to menstrual cycles.

The workshop aimed to empower girls to excel in dance and sports.



## FEF AFRICAN HIP-HOP, ACTION SPORTS AND ICC SUPPORT FOR ABA ADMIN, MOBILITY & STRATEGIC GROWTH WITH EQUIPMENTS

Under the FEF Program geared towards supporting and reinforcing of the viability of existing actions of ABA dedicated to Hip Hop, Action Sports and ICC promoting the development of professional opportunities for young people.

Africa Breaking Academy Hip Hop School was launched in February 2025, offering training skills in Dance and Hip-hop culture. The school provides creative and technical skills to help youth from underserved communities create sustainable livelihoods and overcome economic challenges. Workshops and new programs initiated in the areas of Djing, Graffiti, Photography, Videography and Dance Adjudication Training Program.

As part of our mission to provide professional skills for dancers, ABA partnered with Dj Teckzilla which resulted 29 first-timers. This initiative aligns with our goal to empower ABA team and artists with employable skills to gain sustainability.

Under the FEF Program geared towards the sustainability oriented organization supported ABA Administration and strategic Growth with Equipments such as Camera, Dj turntable, Computer, Office workstation and other needed



accessories.

FEF is proudly supported by The French Embassy in Ghana and Ministries of Europe and Foreign affairs and Halle Tropisme Montpellier.
